## **Speech, Language & Communication**

At the heart of what we do across our nurseries is helping children develop confidence in speaking and understanding the world around them. Each child learns at a different pace and in a different way and our team are here to support them ever step of the way.



To better support our children we are taking part in a county wide focus group which offers a resource from Wellcomm. Wellcomm have developed a screening tool which allows us to further assess

children's speech, language and communication ability and to better target our support for each child as an individual.

The assessment is all play based and will be completed by key workers in nursery and along with our speech and language team at nursery ( Zoe & Lydia ) additional support will be used in our day to day routine and play.

# How will we let me know about my child and WellComm?

We expect to find that many children are not falling behind in their language development. If your child is not in need of any support then your child's key worker will be able to reassure you of this.

If we find that your child needs a little extra help then we will inform you which part of their language development they need support with and how we will be doing this at nursery. More importantly, we will also be asking you to help your child alongside us by carrying out some easy practical activities at home which include songs, rhymes, games and other play activities.
